

Les Parker was member number 1, between himself and a few other like minded Land Rover enthusiasts, decided to form the Lincolnshire Land Rover club back in 1983, without these guys we would not have a club. Although Les has lived abroad for a number of years, he still kept in touch with members of the club and followed the club in whatever we did. My thoughts go to his wife Annie and his family and friends.

So to looking back to 2025, I want to say thanks to all that were on the committee for 2025 and to the ones that have signed up again for this year, we all give our time up voluntarily, and we try and do our best with the time we have available. I think we all try our best to run events to what our members want, however feedback is always welcome to help us improve.

I would like to pass on my thanks to Sue Blackshaw as for the past however many years, (a lot) she has been on the committee and until last year stayed on as our Child Protection Officer, but has decided the time has come to stand down fully, this was with the hope someone would take over this role, unfortunately no one has. We need this role filling to be able to order permits and to run events. The role itself is a silent role, and requires a DBS Check and a couple of virtual seminars a year. Some of these sponsors come within the club and some sat in the room tonight, so thank you.

Our events in 2025 were attended variedly, but for most I think we covered our costs. For events in 2026 we have looked at past entries for all disciplines to see if we can make improvements, we have tried to avoid clashes with special date's in the calendar, and also tried to avoid clashes with other local clubs, this is not always possible, but we have given it some thought, hopefully this will increase numbers. This has allowed the calendar to get published and organised by the end of December. So thanks for Jon for that.

As is the same with some other clubs, competitor numbers remain stagnant, so holding joint events with clubs like LRLRC, P&D AND Yorkshire has allowed competition and numbers attending the events good, a route that as a club we need to continue down. It also means it relieves some of the problems with finding officials from our own club to run the events. In my opinion we get well supported from neighbouring clubs and vice versa, all of P&D comps being in our championship again for 2026, with 2 of our comps also in there championship. We also have 2 of our RTV and CCV'S being run

with the likes of Leicestershire and Rutland, Yorkshire and P&D. Working with other clubs have helped in competition and helps make the events worth running by all, a route we need to continue down.

The bigger events we hosted were well received; Claxby was a fun family weekend with good competition and was well attended. The Malachi that was put on later on in the year was also well attended and enjoyed by all,(apart from maybe the weather), people come and travel to us as they know we can put on a good event, a testament of the hard work everyone puts in. This doesn't go unnoticed.

In 2025, we also co hosted the ALRC National Rally, a lot of time was spent behind the scenes planning this event, and I hope all those that attended enjoyed the weekend and all heard the positive comments from the event. The club all pulled together and this was shown with some members, from outside the committee helping out in any small way they could. Members of the club also came away with a fair amount of silver ware as well. The Nationals made a profit and again has helped with the future proofing of the club, with investments made in equipment, and keeping events costs and membership lower than most other ALRC clubs.

In 2025, some members also travelled far and wide again this year. With trophies being taken back home from the Southern 2 DAY TEAM OF 2 CCV, Eckington and the Majors 2 day Team of 3 CCV.

In 2025 we held our very first Junior comp safari, an initiative to try and get Junior members in to the sport, this was well received and attracted drivers from around the UK, there are tight guidelines for these events to happen, and overall the MSUK and ALRC were very happy with how the club had run the event and is something we will be repeating again at Stainby in 2026.

The club also attended the Newark Land Rover show again and have been asked back for 2026, There are many Shows about for motorsport, and it is a way of promoting the club and hopefully attracting new members into the sport. If anyone would like to go and attend and set up a display, the club can accommodate these members wanting to go and represent the club.

I hope the online magazine has been well received, I have only heard the positives from members, especially those that can now see the photos in colour, and is something they have access to on their emails and the website if they need it.

For 2026 we have also gone digital with our membership, already for 2026 we have increased membership numbers, but it has also allowed us to make the process simpler and less time consuming with the added benefit of making the membership cheaper for the members.

Once again thank you for your support for last year, let's have a great 2026.

Andy is Chief Marshal and will happy to speak to you and assist you on the day of an event.

MARSHAL AND OFFICIAL INCENTIVE 2026

Marshal's and officials at any event are essential for events to run, these roles range from the cofc on the day, the scrutineers, the time keepers, marshals and signing on processes. Without anyone taking on these roles events just cannot run. To encourage members to assist with these roles the committee has devised an incentive scheme starting from the first event of the year running until the last event of the year. The scheme will reward members with a free membership for the following year, so a saving currently of £20. To be part of the incentive the member must be an official at a minimum 6 competitive events in 2026.

As well as the incentive there are also 2 perpetual trophies up for grabs at the annual Presentation evening – Most signed on and Marshal of the year. The committee really appreciate the help that members do when they volunteer and help in any way they can, so that we can all go out and enjoy our sport.

This scheme is a way of saying THANK YOU.

2026 Championship Regulations

1) Title.

The championship will be called the Lincolnshire Land-Rover Club (LLRC) RTV CCV, TYRO and Competitive Safari Championship and will run from Jan 1st to December 31st each year.

2) Eligibility.

All drivers must be paid up members of LLRC and be driving ALRC specification vehicles.

A Motorsport UK Licence must be held the driver and any passengers.

Any events entered on another clubs membership will not be counted towards the championship or backdated if joining later. This includes acting as Clerk of Course for an event.

All drivers must act as Clerk of Course during the championship year. If in the committees opinion a driver doesn't have the experience to Clerk of Course then they may assist another C of C team at an event that season.

A driver may not change class during an event or drive multiple vehicles.

RTV & CCV Trials

All drivers must act as Clerk of Course for a championship event in the discipline they wish to compete in, this is often referred to as gaining an asterix (*). Only two C of Cs will be accepted per event for single day events.

Comp safari

Drivers will be required to set the course, fulfil all other C of C duties but find a suitable C of C for the day of the event to allow them to compete.

TYRO

Due to the nature of these events drivers are not expected to set the sections.

3) Vehicle Eligibility

All vehicles must be ALRC spec for all events and be ALRC log-booked for CCV & Comp Safari. Bring Log book to all events.

4) Points.

Points will be awarded for both class and overall positions.

For all events, points will be awarded for class and overall as follows; 1st place will receive 10 points, 2nd 9 points, 3rd 8 points, 4th 7 points, 5th 6 points, 6th 5 points, 7th 4 points, 8th 3, 9th 2 and 10th 1 point.

Drivers who retire will not receive any points but will be acknowledged as having attended.

Any non-LLRC drivers will be removed from the results before the points are calculated.

If a driver changes class during the season, the driver will continue to accrue overall championship points for both vehicles but only points for each vehicle in the appropriate class.

In the event of a tie at an event the driver with the highest number of penalty free sections will be awarded 1st place. If this does not give a clear winner, the number of sections scoring 1, 2, 3 etc will be used.

If all scores are equal the last person to score a penalty will be deemed the winner. If this does not give a winner the drivers will be required to perform a run-off.

In the event of the championship ending on equal scores, the driver gaining the most first places (or second, third etc) will be awarded the trophy. If this still does not give a clear winner the trophy will be awarded to both drivers.

5) Championship events.

The minimum entry for a class in the championship is 2.

For an end of year trophy an entrant must compete in at least 50% of the total events for that discipline.

If a driver competes in every event in a discipline the worst score will be dropped from the final championship points. This effectively means that you can miss an event without compromising your championship position. This applies to RTV, CCV and Comp Safari.

The P & D Eckington interclub event in August will be included in the championship for all disciplines.

The Day and night comps will count as two events accruing

appropriate championship points from each event.
Comp Safari drivers must complete a minimum of 2/3 of the specified number of runs to be classed as a finisher and gain championship points.

CCV & RTV

In exceptional circumstances, where the committee have allowed the driver to set an event outside of the discipline they are contesting then the driver **must marshal or steward one event in the discipline they are contesting.**

6) Clerks of Course

All events

A maximum of two registered drivers for RTV, CCV and Comp Safari may act as clerk of course at the same event except by written agreement of the committee in advance. Clerk of course duties include collecting equipment, setting out, organising site signage, signing on competitors, taking the money, collecting trophies and officiating on the day of the event, returning the equipment to the appropriate place via the event officer. Failure of these duties could result in the C of C eligibility being withdrawn.

7) Protests.

Any driver or team protesting either points or eligibility on the day must do so within 15 minutes of the scores being declared, after this 'Force Majeure' will take effect.

Protests regarding championship scores must be done within 2 weeks of the scores being published in the club magazine, this must be done in writing to the Championship Tables Officer with a copy to the Secretary for the committee's attention.

9) Ladies Trophy

A trophy will be presented to the best eligible lady. Drivers must enter at least two events to be eligible.

10) Classes

The following class amalgamations will be used for presenting event and championship trophies. See ALRC handbook for full class eligibility:

Our Code of Conduct

Please take your time to read and understand this

Use only rights of way with known, proven or provable vehicular rights. If challenged, discuss; if not resolved, then leave as requested until status is rechecked.

Keep to the defined track. Detour only to pass immovable obstructions. Report any obstructions (including low branches) to the highway authority and the local GLASS Area Representative. Be critical of your own abilities and equipment when assessing an obstruction; it is your right to abate a non-lawful obstruction, but do not commit yourself to a bigger task than you are equipped for.

If the route is not obvious on the ground, ask locally, or check on the maps held at the highway authority offices or consult the local GLASS Area Representative.

Travel at a quiet and unobtrusive pace and as slowly as practicable; we recommend a maximum of 12 mph when in a 4x4 and on an Unsurfaced Right of Way (URoW). Ensure your vehicle is fully road-legal, URoW are subject to the same laws as surfaced roads.

When travelling in groups keep to a small number, four or less in sensitive areas, in other areas up to six vehicles **MAY** be acceptable. Guidance should be sought from the relevant GLASS Area Representative. Weather and ground conditions should also be taken into account. On routes in good condition, split larger parties up and either use a different route or allow a good interval, at least 30 minutes, to elapse before following. With adverse weather and/or poor ground conditions avoid committing a second group to follow the same route.

Do not travel on URoW when they risk being affected beyond a point of natural recovery once the weather improves. If need be, walk some or the entire route first to determine its suitability. Do not use URoW that maybe damaged by the wheel pressure applied by your vehicle.

Avoid damage to trees, hedgerows and boundaries. Some roads carry vehicular rights but are physically too narrow for 4x4s.

Do not practice recovery techniques on any URoW. Use a winch only with extreme caution, and use only the correct equipment and techniques.

Be courteous to other road users - pull over and stop your vehicle for walkers, but pull over, stop your vehicle and switch off the engine for passing horses. Thank those who move over for you.

After consultations with Country Landowners Association and National Farmers Union HQ's, **"best practice"** dictates that gates if they were found to be secured in an open position should be left open and those which are found shut or swinging should be shut behind you; the landowner might appreciate being told about a gate insecurely propped open if you see them.

Keep dogs and children under supervision. Watch out for injured or trapped animals, and report all suspicious events to the landholder.

Guard against all risks of fire. Take your litter home and that left by others if you see it, wherever practicable. Plastic bags can suffocate livestock if swallowed.

Help to keep all water clean. Remember that wildlife faces many threats and URoW are valuable habitats, take special care in spring and early summer. **Follow the Country Code**, it is for your guidance only.

Be considerate of group sizes at meeting points or food stops.
